

Key principles of participatory bioeconomy development

Co-creation: To facilitate the active involvement of a broad spectrum of stakeholders and citizens in the development of strategies.

Openness & Inclusiveness: To ensure that all relevant stakeholder groups will have the opportunity to engage.

Sustainability: To design a bioeconomy that promotes the sustainable use of agricultural, forest and marine ecosystems.
