



Seminar on Circular Bioeconomy Potential

Aim of the event	Showing the invited guests the origin and methods of obtaining the raw material, the possibilities of its use for consumption purposes on the example of other regions and the practical side of the circular approach in the tourism industry.

Short summary

The preparation of the seminar, taking into account the consequences of the following content in subsequent presentations, allowed to show the full picture of the benefits for the tourism industry from the use of local fish resources (especially low value species).



Practical aspects, improving the profitability of individual companies, developing the local market and influencing the general welfare of the local society were indicated. The presentation of the fishing methods showed that the acquisition of small value fish in fisheries targeting the sought-after species (zander, perch) is inevitable and their use should support the local gastronomy. The presentation of Dr. Raftowicz, Wrocław University of Environmental and Life Sciences, proved that the development of economy based on local resources is a

permanent gas pedal of economic development of the whole region. The results of the Cirtoinno project presented as the last presentation on the agenda proved the benefits of using local resources in promoting the tourism industry.

The main goal of the seminar, i.e. to indicate the positive sides of using the principles of circular economy in the region, was achieved. The next step will be to realise the possibilities offered by the valorisation of local resources to local



authorities and to actively involve the representatives of the authorities in the preparation and implementation of local development strategies based on local resources.
