
All together again for our final conference

"Inspiring regional agendas for inclusive bioeconomies" was the title of BE-Rural's Final Conference in Frombork, Poland, 11-14 July 2022. The conference proceedings provide a comprehensive summary of the various working sessions and expert talks that took place during the two days of meetings. Mostly, the conference offered the space for reflecting on the main project outputs and further elaborating in a World Café workshop four targeted policy recommendations on the promotion of co-creation spaces in the bioeconomy. The conference was concluded with field trips providing participants with a glimpse of rural development initiatives happening in the Vistula lagoon region.



BE-Rural's lessons learned and policy guidance

BE-Rural partners took stock on their activities and analysed the three main **participatory tools** applied throughout the project to ultimately come up with a **series of practical lessons learned**. Drawing on evidence-based findings, these lessons learned translate into key recommendations presented in the <u>BE-Rural Policy Paper "Promoting Effective Co-creation Spaces in Regional Bioeconomies"</u>.



Last take-away from the project: three policy briefs

Three **policy briefs** relevant for different governmental levels ultimately derive from our evaluation work made on the stakeholder and public engagement activities undertaken throughout the project. They provide targeted policy recommendations on:

- Improving funding for bio-based business models
- Enabling rural regions to recognise the ecological boundaries framing the bioeconomy
- Mainstreaming the bioeconomy in Pre-Accession Assistance (IPA) projects in the Western Balkans



What about a sustainability screening?

We decided to go the extra mile by conducting a **sustainability screening** on the two pilot regions of Stara Zagora, Bulgaria, and Vidzeme, Latvia. <u>This report</u> aims to support decision-makers in giving further attention to sustainability angles in the development of **regional bioeconomy strategies and roadmaps**.

BE-RURAL NETWORK OF KNOWLEDGE

In order to keep facilitating knowledge exchange amongst the regions after the end of the project, BE-Rural launched on the occasion of the EU Green Week 2022 a pan-European Network of Knowledge. The BE-Rural Network of Knowledge aims to identify and disseminate good practices and to facilitate knowledge sharing across European regions. It is an informal group open to all bioeconomy stakeholders interested in exchanging on experiences about, for example, the elaboration process of bio-based business models, the design and implementation of bioeconomy strategies and roadmaps, or the integration of bioeconomy concepts in academic curricula.
